## **Coursework to Fit Your Needs**

The Shepherd University 4+1 program for the Master of Business Administration degree allows interested and qualified students to complete a bachelor's degree and an M.B.A. in only five years. Students in the 4+1 program focus on their bachelor's degree requirements during their first three years, a mix of bachelor's and M.B.A. requirements in the fourth year, and M.B.A. requirements in the fifth year. Each degree is awarded once the specific degree requirements are successfully met.

#### Admission Requirements

#### M.B.A. 4+1 Applicants Must:

- Complete a minimum of 90 undergraduate credit hours.
- Have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 in all undergraduate coursework.

#### Additional Items for Graduate Admissions:

- Submit a résumé.
- Have two letters of recommendation.
- Complete a letter of intent that describes how the student envisions using the M.B.A. degree to enhance his/her personal and career goals.

#### **Admission Procedure:**

Applicants should fill out a graduate application after meeting all accelerated M.B.A. program admission requirements. All supporting materials should be sent to the Shepherd University Martinsburg Center, 261 Aikens Center, Martinsburg, WV 25404. (The application fee is waived for the graduate application.)

Approval to take graduate courses in the 4+1 program does not constitute a guarantee or promise of future admission to the Shepherd University graduate program.

#### M.B.A. Foundations Program

Students without a business background admitted to the Shepherd M.B.A. program can take the three M.B.A. foundation courses during the senior year. The graduate coursework, either core or for the admission requirement, will appear only on the graduate transcript, and the graduate courses will be calculated at the graduate level. The undergraduate transcript will indicate that graduate courses were used to fulfill the undergraduate requirement. Students will pay for these senior-year credits at undergraduate tuition rates. The foundation courses are:

M.B.A. FDA - Foundations of Accounting (3 cr) M.B.A. FDE - Foundations of Economics (3 cr) M.B.A. FDS - Foundations of Statistics (3 cr)

Accelerated program students must earn at least a "B" grade in each foundation course in order to matriculate into the M.B.A. program. Students who earn less than a "B" will need to retake the course.

#### Accreditation

Shepherd University's M.B.A. program is accredited by the Interna-tional Assembly for Collegiate Business Education and the Higher Learning Commission.

## Curriculum for a Master of Business Administration

No more than 12 credits of graduate credit may be taken by an undergraduate student for this accelerated program. The student must be in good academic standing, with a minimum, cumula-tive 3.0 GPA. Students work closely with their advisor to make sure they are selecting coursework that covers both degree requirements. Additionally, students are encouraged to meet with the the Office of Financial Aid since financial assistance is unique to each student/family situation.

MBA students with no concentration should select 9 hours of electives. Students in one of the named concentrations have a variable number of elective credits.
