Examples of Extenuating Circumstances and Supporting Documentation

Unusual circumstances may occur which impact a student's ability to be successful during an enrollment period. Situations like struggling in a course or withdrawing to change majors are part of regular academic activity and are not considered extenuating.

Examples of extenuating circumstances include, but are not limited to:
