

The McMurran Scholar Award

The highest academic honor granted by Shepherd University, the McMurran Scholar Award, was conceived in 1961 by Professor Kenneth Riley, who served on the first Honors Committee, along with Librarian John Main and Dean of Students O. L. Harry. McMurran Scholars must complete a minimum of 92 semester hours, maintain a minimum 3.86 grade point average, complete two consecutive semesters of study at Shepherd, and be nominated by at least three faculty members. Nominees must then be approved by the entire Shepherd University faculty.

Joseph McMurran, Jr. Shepherd College Principal 1871-1882

Joseph McMurran, Jr., was the first principal of Shepherd College. Son of Joseph McMurran Sr., a man of wealth and influence who served in the Virginia State Legislature, Joseph Jr. was born on the family farm about two miles south of Shepherdstown, the fourth of nine children. After attending local schools, McMurran enrolled in Hampton-Sydney College at age 19, graduating in 1852 with a bachelor of arts degree.

Joseph McMurran began teaching in 1852, and for the next nine years held teaching positions in various private schools and academies in the South. He was teaching in Alabama when the Civil War broke out and returned to Virginia to enlist in a unit which later became known as the Stonewall Brigade. As a member of that unit, he participated in all of its campaigns and engagements. Wounded twice—once in the shoulder at Winchester and once in the lung at Gettysburg—McMurran was captured at Kernstown in 1862 and was confined to a Union prison for six months.

After the war, McMurran returned to the Shepherdstown area and began teaching once again. Utilizing the town hall, which had been built by Rezin Shepherd, a New Orleans merchant born near Shepherdstown, McMurran began plans to organize a college. The building had been converted to a courthouse from 1865 to 1871, but became available when the county seat of Jefferson County was moved back to Charles Town. McMurran was the college's principal from 1871 until 1882. A curriculum was established, faculty were employed, and the college began to function in 1871. Financial support from the new state of West Virginia's Legislature was sporadic and uncertain, and McMurran frequently spent money from his own pocket for building maintenance. Although the enrollment gradually increased, McMurran became discouraged, resigning in 1882, to establish a partnership in a drugstore called Baker and McMurran in Shepherdstown.

Joseph McMurran, Jr., always regarded his role in establishing Shepherd College as the most important achievement of his life. After leaving the college, he remained a firm supporter of its projects and endeavors, responding repeatedly to its needs when called upon. His final service to the institution was as member of the Board of Trustees, a position to which he was appointed in 1886. McMurran died on Saint Valentine's Day 1902.

The "Last Lecture" is a unique opportunity to share with McMurran Scholars the wit and wisdom of the best in the higher education teaching profession, as well as an occasion to honor an extraordinary group of young scholars commencing their journey in the learned professions.

Dr. c. lynne hannah Professor of Education McMurran Convocation "Last Lecturer"

Dr. c. lynne hannah is a native of West Virginia. After graduating from Morgantown High School, she spent a year in Perth, Western Australia, as a Rotary exchange student. She graduated magna cum laude from West Virginia University in elementary education with a minor in special education. Her first teaching job was in Berkeley County and it was during that time that she discovered Shepherdstown and Shepherd University (Shepherd College at that time).

After graduating from West Virginia University with her master's degree in learning disabilities education she went to Montreal, Quebec, to pursue her Ph.D. in educational psychology from McGill University. She graduated on the Dean's Honour List in 1992. Upon finishing her degree, she was hired in the Department of Curriculum and Foundations at Cleveland State University. Here she began her work in social justice education. Along with a number of colleagues and school personnel she established and administered the Urban School-based Teacher Education Program, a professional development school that was located in an urban middle/high school. This program offered an on-site opportunity for teacher education students who were interested in teaching in urban schools. It was in this school that Dr. hannah began the first of many exciting collaborative efforts in the pursuit of creating teacher education programs that utilized a critical pedagogy.

Dr. hannah came to Shepherd College in 1999 and in 2002 became the chair of the Department of Education. It was during her first semester as department chair that she began work on a project that brings her great pride. Working with Vice President Holly Morgan Frye (who at that time was the Director of Student Community Services) and Dr. Keith Leverett (who at that time was the academic manager at the Harpers Ferry Job Corps) they established a critical service-learning experience for her students. As they continued to work together, along with other faculty in the Department of Education, this service-learning experience became an established part of the teacher education programs. Dr. hannah has co-authored numerous publications on this particular program.

Dr. hannah is always happiest when helping her students expand their knowledge and understanding. And in this light, she is extremely proud of her latest publication which she co-authored with three women who are graduates of Shepherd University's Master of Arts in Curriculum and Instruction program. These three women participated in her graduate course on ecopedagogy and it was this course experience that they explored further in their publication. Now retired, Dr. hannah has moved to her farm in the eastern panhandle of West Virginia. This working farm has been in her family for seven generations. She is planning to further her examination of ecopedagogy on the farm.
