### **Core Curriculum Committee**

The Committee met on February 17, 2021. Proposals were reviewed from Education, Appalachian Studies, and Political Science. For the first time, the Committee was asked to consider whether graduate-level classes could meet students Core requirements as part of newly implemented 4+1 graduate programs. The Committee agreed with the logic and reasoning behind the proposal, but instead of adding classes at the 500+ level to the Core Curriculum Worksheet, which Committee members feared would be confusing for students, a motion was made and seconded to handle these specific circumstances regarding Education courses as a standing substitution. The motion passed overwhelmingly. Next meeting will be March 24, 2021.
