

#### The McMurran Scholar Award

The highest academic honor granted by Shepherd University, the McMurran Scholar Award, was conceived in 1961 by Professor Kenneth Riley, who served on the first Honors Committee, along with Librarian John Main and Dean of Students O. L. Harry. McMurran Scholars must complete a minimum of 92 semester hours, maintain a minimum 3.86 grade point average, complete two consecutive semesters of study at Shepherd, and be nominated by at least three faculty members. Nominees must then be approved by the entire Shepherd University faculty.

The McMurran Convocation "Last Lecture" was established by the Shepherd University Senate in 2008 to honor an esteemed retiring or retired professor who has served the University and its students through the quality of his or her teaching, scholarship, and/or service to the campus and community. The "Last Lecture" is a unique opportunity to share with McMurran Scholars the wit and wisdom of the best in the higher education teaching profession, as well as an occasion to honor an extraordinary group of young scholars commencing their journey in the learned professions.

# Dr. Desmond Lawless Adjunct Professor in the School of Recreation, Sport, and Exercise Sciences, retired McMurran Convocation "Last Lecturer"

Dr. Desmond Lawless, born and bred in England, grew up playing on the streets of London. Sport, especially football (soccer), would become not only a passion but a vehicle that allowed him to pursue an education while being able to explore the world. He was not the greatest student; though school bored him, sport kept him on the straight and narrow most of the time. Luckily, the 70s were the genesis of what might be called a movement revolution, where exercise, sport, and nutrition were huge influences on society—as they are today. These themes were to play a huge role in his career.

After attending the West Sussex Institute of Higher Education, then teaching for 2 years in England, he taught physical education in The Bahamas for 5 years then 3 years as a vice principal of the English School in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. During these years, soccer played an influential role in his career as he coached in the United States every summer. In 1990, he completed a master's at the University of Wisconsin-Stout, and in 1991 was appointed head women's soccer coach at Heidelberg University in Tiffin, Ohio. As soccer boomed in the United States, so did Lawless's 21-year career as a coach at Kenyon College in Ohio, and Shenandoah University in Virginia. During that time, he also was an adjunct instructor in sports sciences and a staff coach for the United States Soccer Federation.

His love of soccer, coaching, and teaching served as the stimulus to complete a doctorate at Shenandoah University in 2012 with a dissertation titled "Flow and Self-Efficacy in Small-Sided Games," which explored the motivation of players in practice situations. In 2013, Lawless joined Shepherd University as an associate professor and program coordinator of the Health Promotion and Exercise Science Program in the School of Recreation, Sport, and Exercise Sciences. In that role, he was the lead writer for the first-ever self-study for the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs for the application and reward of national accreditation for the Health Promotion and Exercise Science academic program. Lawless has presented nationally and internationally on topics covering "Leadership and Wellness," "The Importance of Small Sided Games," and "Why Play is Important!" and served on various committees.

Lawless continues to be involved in soccer as a volunteer assistant coach and teaching as an adjunct professor in the School of Recreation, Sport, and Exercise Sciences. He is honored to have been chosen to present the Last Lecture at this year's McMurran Convocation.

# Joseph McMurran, Jr. Shepherd College Principal 1871-1882

Joseph McMurran, Jr., was the first principal of Shepherd College. Son of Joseph McMurran Sr., a man of wealth and influence who served in the Virginia State Legislature, Joseph Jr. was born on the family farm about two miles south of Shepherdstown, the fourth of nine children. After attending local schools, McMurran enrolled in Hampton-Sydney College at age 19, graduating in 1852 with a bachelor of arts degree.

Joseph McMurran began teaching in 1852, and for the next nine years held teaching positions in various private schools and academies in the South. He was teaching in Alabama when the Civil War broke out and returned to Virginia to enlist in a unit which later became known as the Stonewall Brigade. As a member of that unit, he participated in all of its campaigns and engagements. Wounded twice—once in the shoulder at Winchester and once in the lung at Gettysburg—McMurran was captured at Kernstown in 1862 and was confined to a Union prison for six months.

After the war, McMurran returned to the Shepherdstown area and began teaching once again. Utilizing the town hall, which had been built by Rezin Shepherd, a New Orleans merchant born near Shepherdstown, McMurran began plans to organize a college. The building had been converted to a courthouse from 1865 to 1871, but became available when the county seat of Jefferson County was moved back to Charles Town. McMurran was the college's principal from 1871 until 1882. A curriculum was established, faculty were employed, and the college began to function in 1871. Financial support from the new state of West Virginia's Legislature was sporadic and uncertain, and McMurran frequently spent money from his own pocket for building maintenance. Although the enrollment gradually increased, McMurran became discouraged, resigning in 1882, to establish a partnership in a drugstore called Baker and McMurran in Shepherdstown.

Joseph McMurran, Jr., always regarded his role in establishing Shepherd College as the most important achievement of his life. After leaving the college, he remained a firm supporter of its projects and endeavors, responding repeatedly to its needs when called upon. His final service to the institution was as member of the Board of Trustees, a position to which he was appointed in 1886. McMurran died on Saint Valentine's Day 1902.
