What is Dual Enrollment

Students attending a high school in Jefferson County may be enrolled in both high school and college at the same time, while **receiving college and high school credit simultaneously**.

- ➔ Shepherd faculty will teach the courses on the main campus in Shepherdstown.
- ➔ College credits will count toward a degree at Shepherd or will transfer to any accredited university.
- ➔ Enroll in courses at the **reduced rate of \$84 per credit hour**.

Eligibility

Students who wish to enroll in the program must:

- ➔ complete their sophomore year or equivalent of total credits.
- ➔ have an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- ➔ meet the specific ACT or SAT score requirements if they wish to enroll in an English or math course:

How to Apply

- ➔ Meet with your school counselor to determine whether courses will count as required or elective credits. Failure of college courses can affect graduation requirements.
- ➔ Complete the high school dual enrollment application: www.shepherd.edu/admissions/high-school-students
- ➔ Obtain a letter of recommendation from principal, guidance counselor, or homeschool evaluator.
- ➔ Obtain an official copy of high school transcript.
- ➔ Submit all of the above by deadline to Shepherd University Office of Admissions.

Deadline

- ➔ April 1 Fall semester
- ➔ November 1 Spring semester
