## **GREEK LIFE HISTORY**

#### THEN AND NOW

Strolling through campus, one may have noticed a small,

yellow cottage that sits along high street beside Snyder Hall. It is known to date back as far as 1770. You may not have known that the small cottage was once used as a sorority house from the late 1940s to early 1950s by the Phi Sigma Chi chapter, a local sorority. During their time campus, these women met and lived in this small yellow cottage. Throughout the decades, the yellow cottage became a home for the supervisor of building and grounds. In the 1960s it was converted into the nursery school. Currently, the Yellow Cottage is empty. However, a web release was posted in April 2015 from Shepherd's website stating that, "The Yellow House on Shepherd's campus may have a future as a learning lab for historic preservation students." This is all thanks to a \$10,000 survey and planning grant from the WV Division of Culture and History." The house is now referred to as the Entler-Weltzheimer House named after Anneta and her son Frederick Weltzheimer who moved into the house after their home was burned down by a German St. fire. A Local story claims that the ghost of a murdered cobbler still roams the house.

- Phi Sigma Chi later became a national sorority which now operates as the Beta Delta Chapter, Tri-Sigma
- ♦ Phi Sigma Chi recently (April 2015) met up at the Purple Iris of Martinsburg for a reunion where they had close to 20 members who attended.
- ◆ Phi Sigma Chi was one of four local fraternal organizations which were part of the college campus during the 1930s-1950s
