**The McMurrin Scholar Award**

The highest academic honor granted by Shepherd University, the McMurrin Scholar Award, was conceived in 1961 by Professor Kenneth Riley, who served on the first Honors Committee, along with Librarian John Main and Dean of Students O. L. Harry. McMurrin Scholars must complete a minimum of 92 semester hours, maintain a minimum 3.86 grade point average, complete two consecutive semesters of study at Shepherd, and be nominated by at least three faculty members. Nominees must then be approved by the entire Shepherd University faculty.

## **The McMurren Convocation “Last Lecture”**

The McMurren Convocation “Last Lecture” was established by the Shepherd University Senate in 2008 to honor an esteemed retiring or retired professor who has served the university and its students through the quality of his or her teaching, scholarship, and/or service to the campus and community. The “Last Lecture” is a unique opportunity to share with McMurren Scholars the wit and wisdom of the best in the higher education teaching profession, as well as an occasion to honor an extraordinary group of young scholars commencing their journey in the learned professions.

### **Kathleen Corpus, Ph.D. Associate Professor of Family and Consumer Sciences McMurren Convocation “Last Lecturer”**

Dr. Kathleen Kolb Corpus, associate professor and chair of Family and Consumer Sciences, was born in Detroit, Michigan, and raised in Southern California. She earned a bachelor’s degree from California State University, Sacramento, a master’s degree at Washington State University, and a doctorate in family and consumer economics at Kansas State University. Her dissertation was titled “Contributions to Retirement: A Comparison of One-Earner and Two-Earner Families.” Dr. Corpus began her 31-year career in higher education as a faculty member in consumer economics at Mississippi State University, and as a member of the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Experiment Station where she researched family decision making, consumer knowledge of Mississippi families, money management use by Mississippi students, and implementation of a student money management center on the MSU campus. In addition to her academic duties, she provided expert witness testimony regarding the valuation of life for family advocacy court cases.

A family move placed Dr. Corpus in Dodge City, Kansas, where she administered an adult education program, procuring nearly \$1.1 million in funds through the U.S. Workforce Investment Act and Kansas Department of Adult Education. She became a volunteer with the National Park Service at Fort Larned National Historic Site, and expanded her research to include family sustainability and the role of women on frontier military posts. She was the recipient of the 2006 Volunteer of the Year award at Fort Larned National Historic Site.

In 2008, Dr. Corpus joined the Shepherd University faculty in the Family and Consumer Sciences program. Dr. Corpus was instrumental in writing two successful program reviews for the FACS program, and was a major contributor to the International Assembly for Collegiate Business Education Accreditation Self-Report, which resulted in a 10-year accreditation of the Shepherd business program. Dr. Corpus has been recognized by her peers as a recipient of the Outstanding Advisor Award and Outstanding Service Award, and she has maintained a professional credential through the American Association of Family and Consumer Sciences as a Certified Personal and Family Finance Educator.

Dr. Corpus was influential in updating the food science and technology lab, which included acquiring state-of-the-art industrial equipment, and the apparel construction lab, for which she wrote a technology grant to purchase computerized sewing machines. She is a member of many university committees, and currently serves as chair of the Admissions and Credits Committee. She advises all FACS majors and served as an advisor to business administration students while department chair of the Department of Business Administration and FACS.

She was instrumental in bringing Tuba Christmas to Shepherdstown as an annual event. Dr. Corpus has served as an officer of the West Virginia Association of Family and Consumer Sciences as well as a senator to the national AAFCS. Dr. Corpus has been active in the Shepherd student study abroad program having traveled to 14 countries as both a leader and faculty participant, and she was involved in establishing the current student and faculty exchange program with the University of Anáhuac located in Puebla, Mexico.

## Storer College Award

In recognition of the historical significance of Storer College and its commitment to educating students of color in the Eastern Panhandle of West Virginia, Shepherd University recognizes, annually, one faculty member who exhibits a strong commitment to multicultural education through the integration of social justice and diversity in the curriculum, excellence in advising/mentoring of underrepresented student populations at the institution, and research.

## Joseph McMurren, Jr. Shepherd College Principal 1871-1882

Joseph McMurren, Jr., was the first principal of Shepherd College. Son of Joseph McMurren Sr., a man of wealth and influence who served in the Virginia State Legislature, Joseph Jr. was born on the family farm about two miles south of Shepherdstown, the fourth of nine children. After attending local schools, McMurren enrolled in Hampton-Sydney College at age 19, graduating in 1852 with a bachelor of arts degree.

Joseph McMurren began teaching in 1852, and for the next nine years held teaching positions in various private schools and academies in the South. He was teaching in Alabama when the Civil War broke out and returned to Virginia to enlist in a unit which later became known as the Stonewall Brigade. As a member of that unit, he participated in all of its campaigns and engagements. Wounded twice—once in the shoulder at Winchester and once in the lung at Gettysburg—McMurren was captured at Kernstown in 1862 and was confined to a Union prison for six months.

After the war, McMurren returned to the Shepherdstown area and began teaching once again. Utilizing the town hall, which had been built by Rezin Shepherd, a New Orleans merchant born near Shepherdstown, McMurren began plans to organize a college. The building had been converted to a courthouse from 1865 to 1871, but became available when the county seat of Jefferson County was moved back to Charles Town. McMurren was the college's principal from 1871 until 1882. A curriculum was established, faculty were employed, and the college began to function in 1871. Financial support from the new state of West Virginia's Legislature was sporadic and uncertain, and McMurren frequently spent money from his own pocket for building maintenance. Although the enrollment gradually increased, McMurren became discouraged, resigning in 1882, to establish a partnership in a drugstore called Baker and McMurren in Shepherdstown.

Joseph McMurren, Jr., always regarded his role in establishing Shepherd College as the most important achievement of his life. After leaving the college, he remained a firm supporter of its projects and endeavors, responding repeatedly to its needs when called upon. His final service to the institution was as member of the Board of Trustees, a position to which he was appointed in 1886. McMurren died on Saint Valentine's Day 1902.
