The McMurrin Scholar Award

The highest academic honor granted by Shepherd University, the McMurrin Scholar Award, was conceived in 1961 by Professor Kenneth Riley, who served on the first Honors Committee, along with Librarian John Main and Dean of Students O. L. Harry. McMurrin Scholars must complete a minimum of 92 semester hours, maintain a minimum 3.86 grade point average, complete two consecutive semesters of study at Shepherd, and be nominated by at least three faculty members. Nominees must then be approved by the entire Shepherd University faculty.

Joseph McMurren, Jr. Shepherd College Principal 1871-1882

Joseph McMurren, Jr., was the first principal of Shepherd College. Son of Joseph McMurren Sr., a man of wealth and influence who served in the Virginia State Legislature, Joseph Jr. was born on the family farm about two miles south of Shepherdstown, the fourth of nine children. After attending local schools, McMurren enrolled in Hampton-Sydney College at age 19, graduating in 1852 with a bachelor of arts degree.

Joseph McMurren began teaching in 1852, and for the next nine years held teaching positions in various private schools and academies in the South. He was teaching in Alabama when the Civil War broke out and returned to Virginia to enlist in a unit which later became known as the Stonewall Brigade. As a member of that unit, he participated in all of its campaigns and engagements. Wounded twice—once in the shoulder at Winchester and once in the lung at Gettysburg—McMurren was captured at Kernstown in 1862 and was confined to a Union prison for six months.

After the war, McMurren returned to the Shepherdstown area and began teaching once again. Utilizing the town hall, which had been built by Rezin Shepherd, a New Orleans merchant born near Shepherdstown, McMurren began plans to organize a college. The building had been converted to a courthouse from 1865 to 1871, but became available when the county seat of Jefferson County was moved back to Charles Town. McMurren was the college's principal from 1871 until 1882. A curriculum was established, faculty were employed, and the college began to function in 1871. Financial support from the new state of West Virginia's Legislature was sporadic and uncertain, and McMurren frequently spent money from his own pocket for building maintenance. Although the enrollment gradually increased, McMurren became discouraged, resigning in 1882, to establish a partnership in a drugstore called Baker and McMurren in Shepherdstown.

Joseph McMurren, Jr., always regarded his role in establishing Shepherd College as the most important achievement of his life. After leaving the college, he remained a firm supporter of its projects and endeavors, responding repeatedly to its needs when called upon. His final service to the institution was as member of the Board of Trustees, a position to which he was appointed in 1886. McMurren died on Saint Valentine's Day 1902.

The McMurrin Convocation “Last Lecture” was established by the Shepherd University Senate in 2008 to honor an esteemed retiring or retired professor who has served the university and its students through the quality of his or her teaching, scholarship, and/or service to the campus and community. The “Last Lecture” is a unique opportunity to share with McMurrin Scholars the wit and wisdom of the best in the higher education teaching profession, as well as an occasion to honor an extraordinary group of young scholars commencing their journey in the learned professions.

Geri Crawley-Woods, Ph.D., LICSW **Professor of Social Work** **McMurrin Convocation “Last Lecturer”**

Dr. Geri Crawley-Woods grew up on three continents as an “army brat” but has lived in West Virginia nearly all of her adult life. Following graduation from the Ludwigsburg American High School in Germany, she attended Merrimack College in North Andover, Massachusetts, and completed her undergraduate studies in English literature and sociology at the University of Rhode Island in Kingston. She began her social work career in the early 1970s, inspired by the life of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and motivated by his untimely death to become an agent of social change and to help build Dr. King’s vision of “the beloved community.” She pursued the Masters of Social Work degree at The Catholic University of America/ National Catholic School of Social Service in Washington, D.C., and worked in both public and private social service agencies before joining the faculty of Shepherd College in 1976.

She is currently the longest serving full-time faculty member at Shepherd University. While employed at Shepherd, she pursued doctoral studies at the University of Maryland at Baltimore and earned the Ph.D. in social work in 2000. Dr. Crawley-Woods feels privileged to have served the distinguished Social Work Program as a member of the undergraduate teaching faculty for 44 years. She was also director of field education for much of that time and, more recently, served as department chair. Among the many committees on which she has served and chaired, the one that organizes the McMurrin Convocation has been her favorite, and she was pleased to be asked to deliver the “Last Lecture” by her esteemed colleagues.

Last year she was delighted to be nominated by students to receive the Mentzer Award for Inspirational Teaching. She has received the Shepherd University Outstanding Faculty Award for Service for her work locally and regionally. In addition to her contributions as a social work educator, she is a licensed clinician and has been part of private and pastoral therapy practices for many years. She has also worked as a community organizer and social activist.

Upon first moving to West Virginia, Dr. Crawley-Woods was instrumental in the establishment of the Congregational Cooperative Action Project (C-CAP) in Martinsburg and has provided leadership in many community action efforts since that time, including Friends-in-Action of the Eastern Panhandle, and currently in the Promise Neighborhood Burke Street School Initiative, sponsored by the United Way of the Eastern Panhandle and Shepherd University. She has directed community-based research and service, involving social work majors and other students, as part of this program. She has also published and presented research related to poverty, social welfare policy, and curriculum development. She currently serves as the regional director of the PRIDE program, which has trained prospective foster and adoptive parents across a 17-county area from the Eastern Panhandle to the Western part of the state for 16 years. She has been the principal and co-principal investigator for a Title-IV-E federal grant which has also supported the training of public child welfare workers for 26 years.

Upon retirement this year, Dr. Crawley-Woods plans to continue working in the Burke Street School Promise Neighborhood Initiative and to launch an online self-care and mindfulness service for Shepherd students. She will also continue in her most prized role as a grandmother to four young grandchildren.
