## MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF APRIL 23, 2020

The Shepherd University Board of Governors met on April 23, 2020 in a regular meeting, conducted digitally for remote participation, the links to which were publicly posted. Members participating were: Ray Alvarez, David Avella, Gat Caperton, Jim Cherry, Henry Kayes, Jr., Ramona Kissel, Eric Lewis, Allison Lott, Robert Marggraf, Tia McMillan, and Elizabeth Rini. Also present were Shepherd University President Mary J.C. Hendrix, members of the executive leadership team and others.

#### 1. PUBLIC COMMENTS

The Board invited written submissions in its Notice of Meeting; no public comments were received.

#### 2. CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS

M (Kayes), S (Alvarez), PASSED, all members were polled (Mr. Cherry joined the meeting subsequently), that the following resolution be adopted by the Board:

#### 3. UNIVERSITY UPDATE ON VARIOUS TOPICS

President Hendrix and various members of the Executive Leadership Team provided the Board with Updates on Various Topics related to the University response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

### 4. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Hendrix reviewed highlights of the ongoing initiatives for advancing Shepherd from among the comprehensive list provided in the President's Report.

#### 5. FACULTY SENATE ANNUAL REPORT

Dr. Christopher Lovelace, President of the Faculty Senate and Associate Professor of Psychology, presented to the Board the Faculty Senate Annual Report. Dr. Lovelace noted that the Senate took up a pair of related issues concerning academic lecturers, and the best way to quantify faculty workload. He commented on how important Academic Affairs and donor funds are in supporting the professional development of faculty, especially this year. He acknowledged that the Faculty Senate's Scholarship and Awards Committee provided 46 McMurran Scholarships this year. As Dr. Lovelace concluded his final term as Faculty Senate President, he congratulated Dr. Heidi Hanrahan as the new Faculty Senate President and thanked President Hendrix and Provost Beard for their strong support of shared governance at Shepherd. Chair Lewis thanked Dr. Lovelace for his time.

- 6. REPORT OF THE ACADEMIC PROGRAMS AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE
  On behalf of the Academic Programs and Development Committee, Mr. Alvarez provided a brief
  update of the Committee's discussions which included the New Degree Program, Bachelor of
  Science in Nutrition, the 2019-2020 Academic Program Reviews, and an update from University
  Development. Chair Lewis noted they are thinking about communication and now is not the time
  to roll out the Comprehensive Campaign. It was requested that a discussion regarding the
  Comprehensive Campaign be added to the June BOG agenda.

On behalf of the Enrollment, Student and Community Affairs Committee, Mr. Caperton provided a brief update of the Committee's discussions which included the Campus Safety Annual Data Report.

  On behalf of Finance and Facilities Committee, Mr. Kayes, provided a brief update of the
  Committee's discussions which included the Human Resources Annual Report, and an Update as
