

Road Map to Foster Care and Adoption Care Training

WVPRIDE training consists of twenty-one hours of Level I (or Pre-Service training). These are held in seven (7) - three (3) hour sessions.

There are also nine (9) hours of Trauma training required. Typically the trauma classes are scheduled within one (1) month of the Pre-Service completion date.

The trainer will compile all the information from the training sessions and send them to the WVFACT office to be processed.

You will receive a certificate after completing all training requirements.

Attend the Pre-Service trainings (21 hours) and take the Post-Test.

Note: If you cannot make all the trainings as scheduled, you can also do make up sessions either at another location or wait for the trainings to be held again in the same location.

Decide which trainings are best for your needs and schedule.

Contact the WVFACT office at 304-716-4998 to complete a registration for the Level 1 (or Pre-Service) Training Sessions

Call WVFACT at least 48 hours prior to beginning the Trauma Round (Trauma 1, 2, & 3) to register.

These classes are usually scheduled at all locations within a month of Pre-Service sessions ending and is a requirement for all foster/adoptive parents to attend.

Additionally, we often offer another session after Trauma 3 to complete the 12 hours of continuing education for Foster/Adoptive Parents per year.

Provide a loving and stable home for a child when they need it most.

Things to remember:

- WVPRIDE Training is free to all West Virginia Residents who want to become Foster or Adoptive Care Parents;
- You will need to attend an orientation, at which time please bring a valid photo ID;
- You will be fingerprinted. This is typically done during orientation;
- Due to the sensitive nature of topics covered, you are not permitted to bring children to any WVPRIDE training.
