These departments have agreements with the Honors Director to ensure that the aims of HNRS 488 are met in a capstone preparation course students take prior to their final semester. ***Variable credit for HNRS 489: Most Honors students take HNRS 489 for 1 credit. HNRS 489 should only be taken for 2-3 credits by prior aproval of the Honors Director if there is substantial additional research undertaken outside major capstone courses after the student completes HNRS 488 or the equivalent contracted course.

****Contract option for Honors electives: Honors students on the Honors track may contract (in other words, arrange with a professor to take a non-Honors course for Honors credit) two courses for Honors elective credit. Such courses must be at the 300- or 400-level and are usually taken in a student's major or minor.
