RE: edTPA Requirements

To Whom It May Concern:

As per the Shepherd University Transition to edTPA plan in place with the West Virginia Department of Education since Fall 2018, the following procedures and requirements remain in effect across and throughout the Educator Preparation Program at Shepherd University.

PLEASE NOTE:

- PASSING the edTPA has been in place as both a <u>state and program requirement</u> for graduation and a recommendation for certification since the Fall 2018-2019 school year. Only candidates successfully completing the Shepherd University program of study, including successfully passing the edTPA, will be recommended for graduation and certification with the state.
- Initial edTPA submissions should be completed and submitted during the first seven (7) weeks of the student teaching placement and/or Residency II semester. Any delays including score reporting beyond the student teaching/Residency II semester will cause an inability to graduate on time. Completing and passing the edTPA is required before recommendations for graduation and certification can be made. If the edTPA is not passed by the end of the ST/Residency II semester, graduation and certification will be delayed by at least one semester.
- Passing Cut Scores for the edTPA as of Spring 2022 (and beyond) are as follows:

Elementary Education	World Languages	All Other Specialization
Specialization	Specialization	Areas
Cut Score: 44/90	Cut Score: 32/65	Cut Score: 37/75

- From the start, be sure to submit your <u>best work</u> and <u>complete work</u>. Incomplete or unscored edTPA submissions must be resubmitted by the student <u>at the candidate's expense</u>. Shepherd University will not cover the cost of resubmissions.
- Final Note: Passing scores received after grades are due to the Registrar and/or beyond the end of the semester will delay a candidate's graduation. Candidates who have not successfully completed the edTPA by the end of the ST/Residency II semester will receive an incomplete grade for EDUC 461 (Student Teaching Seminar) until passing scores are received. These candidates may also be required to register for an EDUC 390 course during the subsequent semester to provide an additional field experience for the candidate to successfully complete / pass the edTPA and resolve the Incomplete for EDUC 461.
