





GETTING STARTED

PARKING DECALS

PAYING BILLS

You will receive a bill via your Shepherd email for tuition and room and board prior to the start of classes. 60% is due prior to the first day of classes and the remaining 40% is due after the start of the semester. Bills may be paid via RAIL or with check at the Business Office. Payment plans can also be set up through the Business Office. Be sure to pay attention to your bill for payment deadlines.

RAVE EMERGENCY ALERTS

We offer a text-messaging notification system to send you emergency communications, including inclement weather announcements. Register your mobile number and email to receive notifications using the link below. Parents/guardians may also subscribe to RAVE alerts.

GETTING STARTED



RAIL

Remote Access Information Line (RAIL) is Shepherd's system for student records and class registration. You can use RAIL to add or drop classes, check grades, view your class schedule, view and accept/decline financial aid, pay your bill, request transcripts, retrieve your network username and password, and keep your contact information up to date.

Your User ID is your nine-digit student ID number which can be located on the back of your RAMBLER card. Upon your first login, your PIN is your six-digit birth date in MMDDYY format, and you'll be prompted to change your PIN and set a security question.

STUDENT EMAIL & NETWORK ACCOUNTS

All university-specific communications are sent to your Shepherd student email account, and you'll want to monitor the account on a regular basis. Your email address is your Shepherd network username + @rams.shepherd.edu.

To locate your network name, login to RAIL, click the Personal Information tab, and click Lookup Your Username. You can establish your network password by clicking the Personal Information tab, clicking Password Management and Change Password. (NOTE: It will take approximately 10 minutes for your password to update.)

Your username and password are the same for campus-owned computers, internet in residence halls, Wi-Fi access, email, Brightspace, RamPulse, Good Living Portal, and personal/shared network disk space.

SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS

All students receiving financial aid (federal, state, or institutional) must be making satisfactory academic progress (SAP) for funds to be released. SAP guidelines include (1) completing 70% of attempted credit hours, (2) maintaining a 2.0 cumulative GPA, and (3) graduating within 180 credit hours. If a student fails to meet SAP requirements, an appeal must be completed prior to financial aid issuance.





DESIGNATED PARKING LOTS

Dual enrollment students are permitted to park in any designated commuter lot with the official Shepherd University parking pass purchased from SUPD.

- A-Lot: Behind the Byrd Science Center and in front of White Hall. Entrance and exit at High Street only.
- King Street: (unless otherwise designated by signage)
 Students/staff are prohibited from metered spaces and from Admissions Office spaces.
- C-Lot: Adjacent to K-Lot; entrance from Rt. 480.
- L-Lot: Entrance from King Street at Gardiner; ONE WAY.
- F-Lot: (unless otherwise designated by signage) In front of the Frank Arts Center and Butcher Center.

- **G-Lot:** (except where designated for F/S or SUPD) In front of the Frank Arts Center.
- H-Lot: (Residential and Commuter Students, F/S, Registered Visitors) Between the Suites of West Woods and the Apartments.
- K-Lot: Behind Erma Ora Byrd Hall.

academic advisor	Your advisor is assigned to work with you on building your degree plan and planning your class schedules.
affinity groups	Student organizations promoting the needs of underrepresented populations/groups.
Brightspace	Our online learning management system (LMS) used to access course materials and more.
catalog	Outlines the University's mission, vision, core academic policies and procedures, and degree outlines.
core curriculum	Your advisor is assigned to work with you on building your degree plan and planning your class schedules.
commuter	A student not residing in an on-campus residence hall (travels to-and-from campus each day).
Dean's List	An academic achievement honoring students who maintain a 3.4 GPA for the semester and carry a 12-hour coursework minimum.
electives	Courses allowing you to explore your unique interests that also count toward degree requirements.
Eastern Panhandle Transit Authority (EPTA)	Free transportation on campus grounds during the semester.
Games Zone	A hang out zone on campus, featuring bowling lanes, billiard tables, arcade games, and more (located on the second floor of the Student Center).
Good Living Portal	Online portal to access housing, meal plan, and roommate information.
office hours	Designated hours when a faculty member is available to meet with students to address questions and concerns or provide academic advising.

Program Board (PB)	A student-led committee on campus, hosting a variety of events throughout the year.
quiet floor (library)	The third floor of the Scarborough Library reserved as a quiet space to study and complete work.
Rambo	Our mascot that can be seen at many events on campus.
RAMBLER	Your official student ID card. (Carry it at all times!)
RamPulse / Corq	Our online portal to discover clubs/organizations and view a running list of all upcoming campus events.
RAVE	Text messaging alert system used in weather-related incidents and other emergencies.
resident	A student residing in an on-campus residence hall.
resident assistant (RA)	Peer leaders overseeing resident hall activities, fostering a sense of community, providing support, and ensuring the safety of all student residents.
Student Government Association (SGA)	Student governing body that works to establish representation for the entire campus and hear questions/concerns from students.
student handbook	An outline of the university policies and procedures.
study abroad	An opportunity to visit different countries while continuing to study in courses related to your degree.
Tabler Farm	This 158-acre farm is home of our Agricultural Innovation Center and it's located minutes from campus.
The Picket	A student-managed news organization founded in 1896.
The Little House	This building is just like it sounds! Located behind White Hall and built in 1928, it was part of a former project for student teachers.
