Students attending a high school in Jefferson County may be enrolled in both high school and college at the same time, while receiving credits at both schools simultaneously. Students can enjoy a discounted rate of \$84 per credit hour. College credits will count toward a degree at Shepherd University and can be transferred to most colleges and universities nationwide.
